This combination makes the region the perfect place to blend days of sport with first class gastronomic experiences, while visiting cities and towns full of history.

This guide suggests a tour of the main golf courses in Castilla-La Mancha, while offering some travel ideas (only a few, because there are so many potential options) so that visitors can combine and tailor their sporting experience with interesting excursions delving into the world of wine, architectural heritage, cuisine, etc.

Golf Pinaíllas *Albacete*

18 holes

Pinaíllas Golf Club features an 18-hole, par 72 course, designed by Seve Ballesteros, whose wide fairways, rough density, and the movement on the greens make it an excellent course for all players of all standards.

The club also has the necessary facilities for practising and learning golf, as well as a large clubhouse with lounges, meeting rooms, and a café and restaurant service, in addition to a multi-sports area with a 7-a-side football pitch, tennis courts and a large swimming pool and grassland to enjoy in summer.

Albacete is a university city, with excellent shopping options, a vibrant after-work atmosphere, a strong cutlery-making tradition and its September Festival, declared of International Tourist Interest. From Albacete and heading towards the La Manchuela region, where Las Pinaillas is located, you may, after a day of golf, visit and enjoy a relaxing trip to villages such as **Alcalá del Júcar and Jorquera**, both impressive and with spectacular sweeping views. The **La Manchuela Wine Route** showcases this region's finest wines, recommending the leading varieties to make your trip extremely enjoyable.

La Lagunilla El Bonillo (Albacete)

9 holes

La Lagunilla de El Bonillo Golf Course is a 9-hole course inaugurated in June 2009. It's located in "La Lagunilla", on the road to the Lagunas de Ruidera Natural Park. It features a driving range, and has an annual calendar with around 40 tournaments. It meets the standards of the Royal Spanish Golf Federation.


El Bonillo is a peaceful town in La Mancha, whose **main square and parish church, both in Renaissance style**, impress visitors. El Bonillo has been able to preserve its heritage over the centuries. During your visit, enjoy (in its parish museum) works by the circle of Ribera, Salzillo, Vicente López and Andrea del Sarto, as well as a Christ Carrying the Cross by El Greco. From El Bonillo, visit nearby **Munera**, also steeped in Cervantes tradition, and Lezuza, and admire the Libisosa archaeological site, recently declared an Archaeological Park; the monument city of Alcaraz; and of course, a visit to the nearby Lagunas de Ruidera natural park, which are all excellent local excursions.



La Caminera Club de Campo Torrenueva (Ciudad Real)

9 holes

La Caminera boasts an unbeatable natural setting in Ciudad Real. A sea of olive trees surround a 9-hole golf course offering a fun, stimulating experience at one with nature. Peace and sport coexist perfectly in this idyllic open-air enclave.

Visitors can also enjoy the **Wine Route of Valdepeñas**, a town steeped in winemaking history, with an extensive network of wineries of all kinds: some traditional and historic, others avant-garde and contemporary.

You can also visit the nearby Cerro de las Cabezas archaeological park, a firstclass Iberian site just off the Andalusia motorway, and we recommend a visit to the Valdepeñas Wine Museum.

Valdepeñas is also equidistant from **Campo de Montiel** to the east and **Campo de Calatrava** to the west. In the Campo de Montiel, so often mentioned by Cervantes in Don Quixote "...and it was the truth and walked by the way...", visitors can explore the monumental **Villanueva de los Infantes** -Quevedo is buried in the local church-, and La Torre de Juan Abad -which houses the House Museum where Quevedo lived-, Montiel and Alhambra with their towering castles, and the **Lagunas de Ruidera**, one of Castilla-La Mancha's natural parks, featuring the quixotic Cueva de Montesinos. In Campo de Calatrava, **Almagro** welcomes travellers with its Corral de Comedias (a Spanish open-air courtyard), famous aubergines and bobbin lace. The Calatrava castle in Aldea del Rey, and the imposing Renaissance palace of Viso del Marqués will leave you speechless. A family excursion to the Cerro Gordo volcano is also an excellent option in Campo de Calatrava.

Abedul Golf9 holes P&PAlcázar de San Juan (Ciudad Real)

Located in Alcázar de San Juan, the facilities feature 20 roofed practice ranges and a surface area of 12,000 square metres. There is also a putting green and a chipping and bunker zone with a total surface area of 3,200 square metres.

Next to the driving range lies a 9-hole Pitch & Putt with 18 different tees, par 54, 1,481 metres in length, a course with bunkers and water hazards, as well as a lake with 5,500 cubic metres that helps to irrigate the facilities in a comfortable, safe, fun and aesthetically pleasing environment, featuring typical local vegetation.

In Alcázar de San Juan, the local essence is undoubtedly quintessentially Manchegan. This extensive natural region is located in the heart of the Castilla-La Mancha region, where Don Quixote, windmills, cheese and wine take centre stage, with numerous other highlights vying for visitors' attention. The La Mancha Wine Route is the backbone of an extensive network of optional excursions in Alcázar de San Juan and the neighbouring towns: Villarrobledo and its pottery tradition, Socuéllamos and its Torre del Vino Museum, Tomelloso and its historic wine heritage, El Toboso - Dulcinea's homeland -, Campo de Criptana and its windmills, Argamasilla de Alba and its Cueva de Medrano, La Solana with its Zarzuela (a Spanish lyric-dramatic genre) Week and Pedro Muñoz with his Manchegan May Day festivals. In Alcázar de San Juan, don't miss the Casa del Hidalgo, the windmills of Cerro de San Antón and the Torreón del Gran Prior.

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Golf Ciudad Real *Ciudad Real*

9 holes

Golf Ciudad Real is a 9-hole course with 3 rounds and different tee-offs, designed by European Golf Design and built in 2004.

This 18 hole course has 7 par 4's, 9 par 3's and 2 par 5's, featuring an impressive design and requiring precision putting due to the large surface area of its wide greens with varying, difficult slopes.

The city founded by Alfonso X El Sabio in 1255 is today a modern university city and communication hub with southern Spain due to the high-speed train. In addition to its excellent **gastronomy**, visitors can enjoy shopping and cultural outings, thanks to the city's various museums: the Diocesan Museum, the López Villaseñor Museum, the Quixote Museum, the Elisa Cendrero Museum, etc. We recommend seeing the unique carillon clock in the main square and the nearby **Alarcos Archaeological Park** (in Poblete), an interesting site around what was the last great battle where the Moors emerged victorious in the Reconquista, and the castle of Calatrava la Vieja.


Furthermore, due to Ciudad Real's location in the heart of the province, it is the ideal starting point for trips to the **Cabañeros and Tablas de Daimiel** national parks, where you can also visit La Motilla del Azuer, an impressive fortified prehistoric well - the oldest in the Peninsula.

Cuenca Golf Club *Villar de Olalla (Cuenca)*

18 holes

Cuenca Golf Club has an 18-hole, par 72 course, where golf enthusiasts of all kinds can enjoy playing a complex route requiring a wide variety of shots, meaning all the clubs in the bag have to be deployed. Its facilities include a driving range and shop, as well as infrastructures for playing other sports and a restaurant featuring traditional Cuenca cuisine with some modern flair.

This stunning golf course's proximity to the city of Cuenca makes it easy to visit a destination that has been declared a **World Heritage Site** by UNESCO since 1996. With a Muslim foundation and a breathtaking urban setting, perched atop the gorges of the Júcar and Huécar rivers, Cuenca is a destination that visitors always return to: its **Hanging Houses** - the city's icon -, its unique local cuisine (zarajos - lamb intestine tapa-, morteruelo - pig liver, alhajú - an almond-based dessert, resolí - local liquor, etc.) and the modern art featured not only in its **Museum of Abstract Art**, but in the whole city, make it a unique place. The Palaeontological and Science Museums are excellent options for a family excursion. **Easter** in Cuenca and its **International Religious Music Week** are declared to be of International Tourist Interest.

Golf Molino de Rus San Clemente (Cuenca)


18 holes Rural

Founded in 1996, the club currently has around 200 members and 110 federated players. The rural course features 18 holes and 27 tees, a demanding challenge. It boasts a practice area, changing rooms, club room, shop, lounges, café, and restaurant. It hosts tournaments and competitions monthly. It's near the Ermita de la Virgen de Rus, about 7 km from the town centre of San Clemente.

After enjoying a day of golf, we recommend continuing the fun -this time with the golf clubs packed away- by visiting the town of **San Clemente**. The fact that it was once the capital of the Marquisate of Villena means that today it still preserves impressive architectural heritage: its Renaissance-style square and town hall, and its parish church dedicated to St. James the Apostle, are just a few examples. We also recommend visiting the neighbouring villages in the area, such as **Alarcón**, with its photogenic castle - now a Parador hotel - crowning the village and circled by the meandering **Júcar River**, and its streets dotted with monumental churches such as those of Santo Domingo de Silos, St. Mary, and St. John the Baptist - home to the original mural paintings of Jesús Mateo. Mota del Cuervo, with its typically La Mancha windmills, and **Belmonte** with its wonderfully restored **castle** and its majestic collegiate church are other must-see destinations.














La Vereda Villalba de la Sierra (Cuenca)

9 holes Rural

A rural course located along the Vereda Real de Cuenca, it has 18 tees and 9 sand tees. It can be reached by taking the highway to Tragacete (Ciudad Encantada) about 18 km from Cuenca, along a road on the left about 200 m from the "EL SITIO" country cottage. The town, about 70 metres wide, is flanked by a thick pine forest.


Villalba de la Sierra's proximity to nature is where its name comes from. The Serranía de Cuenca (Cuenca Mountains) natural park means that after playing golf, this destination offers some wonderful excursions. The Serranía de Cuenca is home to small villages seemingly straight out of a fairy tale, and the picturesque landscapes on the horizon help visitors to disconnect from everyday life. Boasting some of Spain's lowest light pollution levels, the Serranía de Cuenca has the prestigious **Starlight** seal. which accredits destinations ideal for astronomical tourism. A night-time activity contemplating and learning about the breathtaking immensity of the Universe is sure to be an unforgettable experience. This area is also home to El Hosquillo, a wildlife interpretation centre, where you can enjoy learning about the animal life of species such as bears, wild boars, deer, birds of prey, etc. (we recommend booking well in advance). Furthermore, if you're an archaeology fan, visit the site of Noheda -and its Roman villa with the richest mosaics in the Peninsula- in Villar de Domingo García, which offers an excellent excursion after packing your clubs away for the day.



Cuesta Blanca *Motilla del Palancar (Cuenca)*

9 holes Rural

Surrounded by pristine nature and perfectly integrated into the environment, Cuesta Blanca is a rural golf course with 9 holes, 18 tees, par 72. Its maximum length is 5,975 metres. It hosts tournaments of different categories. The club dates back to 1980 and was federated in 1993.

This time, the ideal option to continue the fun after packing your clubs away is to take a wine tourism trip to the destinations on the **Manchuela Wine Route**: its wineries, cuisine and villages offer excellent options. In addition to Alarcón, Enguídanos and the natural site of "Las Chorreras", Villanueva de la Jara with its rich **architectural heritage** around Teresa de Jesús, and the town of Moya -on the border with the neighbouring Valencian Community- represent a rich variety of heritage and nature-based options. The cave paintings of Villar del Humo, part of the **Rock Art** of the Iberian Mediterranean Basin -declared a **World Heritage Site by Unesco**-, are also an interesting attraction. A walk through Cañete and a photo session in its "Illustrated Landscape" offer an unforgettable experience.

Layos Golf Layos (Toledo)

18 holes

Located 12 km from Toledo, Golf Campo de Layos and its residential complex extend over an estate of more than 100 hectares in the municipality of Layos (Toledo), in the Los Montes de Toledo region, bordering the Guajaraz creek and reservoir. A natural environment offering golfers magnificent views throughout the course. A balanced, demanding course where long holes alternate with fairways and greens well defended by bunkers and four lakes that come into play on six holes (1, 8, 10, 10, 14, 15 and 17).

Its proximity to the city of Toledo, declared a **World Heritage Site** by UNESCO in 1986, makes this course ideal for an excursion to this wonderful destination: there is always something new to discover when visiting Toledo. Roman Toledo, Visigothic Toledo, Muslim Toledo, etc., the Toledo of countless churches and convents, the Toledo of the School of Translators and Alfonso X the Wise, the Toledo of the Three Cultures, the imperial and communal Toledo of Charles V, the Toledo of El Greco, etc. and so forth until today, where a cosmopolitan city with Spain's **most impressive panoramic views** welcomes travellers from all over the world with its stunning beauty embraced by the Tagus River. Toledo wants to welcome you too. The nearby **Puy du Fou** park makes it an ideal choice for a family holiday. From Layos, you can also visit the neighbouring towns of **Orgaz and Guadamur**, both of which have a rich heritage. The latter is home to the archaeological site of Guarrazar, which comes highly recommended.

Palomarejos Golf Talavera de la Reina (Toledo)

Palomarejos Golf is an 18-hole par 72 course adapted to all levels of play, offering an entertaining and relaxing day of golf in the shelter of the Gredos and San Vicente Mountains.

Careful design of the natural environment and five large lakes make the course ideal for both high level tournaments and everyday play for beginners.

It features its own Golf School, a practice course with 30 tees, buggy rental, golf shop and a club house noteworthy due to its attractive decoration and its impressive range of leisure activities, restaurants and social events.

The golf course is located in Talavera de la Reina. This city's pottery was declared along with ceramics from El Puente del Arzobispo - **Intangible Cultural Heritage** by UNESCO in 2019.

Visitors can go shopping, enjoy a fun **foodie experience**, and explore the city on a guided tour, discovering its **Roman archaeological remains** (Caesarobriga), its imposing medieval walls (Talabayra), the Ruiz de Luna Museum, the **Basilica of Nuestra Señora del Prado**, and the soul of the city, its omnipresent **pottery**.

If you want to continue sightseeing in the area, visit the region of La Jara to the south, the region of Sierra de San Vicente to the north, and the region of La Campana de Oropesa.

Club de Golf Torrijos Novés (Toledo)

11 holes

This Club has a course featuring 11 different holes, where skill is the most important quality to achieve good results. The land is practically flat, and water plays a major role. The environment is extremely peaceful. Nature is not disturbed by the golf course's presence. On the contrary, it is at its most impressive throughout the 11 holes. The variety of fauna is remarkable, with extremely varied vegetation. Players can enjoy playing on a quiet, friendly and easily walkable course only 45 minutes from Madrid.


Torrijos is a surprising destination, offering unexpected delights such as the imposing and majestic **Collegiate Church of Corpus Christi**, by one of the great architects of the Spanish Renaissance, Alonso de Covarrubias, who was born here. He designed the parish church of Novés, dedicated to St. Peter. Visitors to Torrijos can explore the **palace of King Peter I of Castile** - "Cruel" for some, "Just" for others-, and enjoy travelling the **Méntrida-Toledo Wine Route**, featuring the region's finest wineries.

Señorío de Illescas Illescas (Toledo)

9 holes

A modern, functional facility designed to serve the population in the south of Madrid. Excellent facilities specially tailored for beginners to golf and for playing Padel. Products designed for all ages, all levels and all audiences.

Illescas is a destination where visitors can enjoy excellent cuisine, but also rich local and regional historical heritage. Illescas is home to no fewer than **five paintings by El Greco**, located in the same place where they were conceived and commissioned from the Cretan by birth and Toledan by adoption: the **sanctuary of the Virgen de la Caridad**. The parish church of Illescas is known as "la Giralda de la Sagra", and La Sagra is the natural region connecting Toledo with Madrid, whose name comes from Arabic and means "red earth". Therefore, traditional brick factories can be found in this part of the province. We also recommend exploring the nearby town of **Carranque**, where you can visit a **Roman villa** with stunning figurative mosaics in its archaeological park. Don't leave without also visiting nearby **Esquivias**, where the most precious treasure is preserved - in its parish church - the marriage certificate of Cervantes to Catalina de Palacios, a native of this town, and the **Cervantes House Museu**m, where the great writer spent long periods after his marriage, and where, according to many Cervantists, he found the inspiration to create several Quixotic characters.



Montealvar Yebes (Guadalajara)

18 holes

Montealvar is a very player-friendly course with 6 tees covering every conceivable range of distances, so that anyone from professional to beginner can enjoy the course. The course lies on fairly flat terrain, although several watercourses have to be negotiated via winding paths or bridges. Several growing trees combine with huge century-old holm oaks and three lakes that do not affect play too much. The fairways are wide, the rough is extremely generous, there are several amoeba-shaped but fairly flat bunkers and the greens are fast, wide and rolling.

From Yebes, we recommend visiting the region of **La Alcarria**, to discover the towns in this region of Guadalajara immortalised by the Nobel Prize winner Camilo José Cela in his "Journey to La Alcarria". Towns such as **Pastrana, Trillo, Brihuega, Torija, Cifuentes**, etc. offer exquisite local cuisine and a fascinating architectural heritage. We also recommend a visit to **Recópolis** -an archaeological park-, the only city with a proven Visigothic foundation (founded by Leovigild in honour of his faithful son Recaredo), in the town of Zorita de los Canes.

Green Sire Golf Cabanillas *Cabanillas del Campo (Guadalajara)*

18 full-length holes + 9 P&P holes

The Cabanillas Golf Course is one of the best 18-hole courses in Castilla-La Mancha, on a par with the best courses in the neighbouring Community of Madrid. It's a fun, entertaining course. It was created in 1994 as a 9-hole course and in 2004 it became an 18-hole course. During the first 9 holes, designed by Manuel Piñero, players encounter wide fairways and several water hazards that will play a major role. Stirling & Martin's design for the second 9 holes represents a challenge for players.

From Cabanillas del Campo, we recommend heading to the north of the province to explore the **Sierra Norte de Guadalajara Nature Reserve**, home to the southernmost beech forest in the Iberian Peninsula: the **Tejera Negra beech forest**. The black tile, or slate, also gives its name to the villages in this part of Guadalajara: **the Black Architecture villages**. Umbralejo, Valverde de los Arroyos, Campillo de Ranas, to name but a few. The calm and the connection with nature, almost untouched by human hands, will make you forget the stress of everyday life. Furthermore, a large chunk of Guadalajara province, due to its low light pollution, forms part of the "**Cielos de Guadalajara**" Starlight reserve, making it an excellent destination for astronomical tourism.

Golf Cifuentes *Cifuentes (Guadalajara)*


Cifuentes owes its name to the abundance of springs in the surrounding area (up to a hundred), which give rise to the Tagus tributary bearing the same name, and is located in the heart of the **La Alcarria** region, whose natural surroundings offer travellers a sharply contrasting landscape, with the coexistence of moorlands, the extensive countryside dominated by fertile meadows, valleys and hills.

A day's golf can always be rounded off with a stroll through the village streets to marvel at the **Church of San Salvador**, with its spectacular **Romanesque façade dedicated to St. James the Apostle**: its construction is a mixture of Romanesque, Gothic, Renaissance and Baroque styles. **The Convent of Santo Domingo** is another must, with the church's particularly noteworthy Renaissance façade, and currently home to the **Santo Domingo Art Centre** and the Cifuentes Visitor Reception Centre. A pleasant walk through the streets of Cifuentes allows you to discover its unique, quintessentially Castilian, triangular 16th-century main square; the Casa de los Gallos, a 16th-century mansion; and its imposing castle built by the Infante Don Juan Manuel, lord of the town and nephew of Alfonso X the Wise.

Near Cifuentes, we also recommend visiting **Brihuega**, a town bursting with historical heritage and famed for its lavender fields, which acquire their splendour and characteristic colour every July with the **Lavender Blossom**, and that each year bring an extensive cultural and festive programme featuring concerts, street markets and activities for all ages. **Trillo** is also worth a visit, along with other villages in La Alcarria, such as **Durón**, Pastrana, Sacedón, etc. typical villages of La Alcarria, so masterfully portrayed by **Camilo José Cela** in his **Journey to La Alcarria**.
